- AJR 11 (Carillo), Chap. 136, 2019, which urged the President and Congress to enact legislation to provide permanent legal status and a path to citizenship for immigrant youths and individuals with Deferred Enforced Departure and Temporary Protected Status.
- AJR 46 (Gonzalez-Fletcher), Chap. 204, Stats 2018, which urged the President and the
 federal government to immediately cease the implementation of the "zero tolerance" policy,
 not propose any additional inhumane immigration policies in the future, and called for
 compassion and decency for all individuals, families, and children who arrive at the border
 seeking a better life.
- SR 114 (De Léon, et al.), 2018, which denounced the separation of immigrant families and called for just and humane immigration proceedings that protect family units, ensure the welfare of children and domestic violence survivors, and provide for an accessible asylum process.
- SJR 29 (Pan), Res Chap. 245, 2018, which called upon Congress to issue a formal apology to all child detainees and the parents of those children who were forcibly separated by the federal government in 2018 under its "zero-tolerance" border policies.
- AJR 10 (Santiago), Res Chap. 143, 2017, which urged Congress to support the Access to Counsel Act to ensure that those persons detained while attempting to enter the United States would be guaranteed access to legal counsel.
